# **Exercise Will Be Fun at PVRC's New Fitness Center**

The installation of Palm Village's new Fitness Center in the lower level means residents now have easy access to high-quality exercise equipment that can be used to improve their overall health.

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), most people age 65 and older don't do enough strength training to stay strong.

A January, 2004 CDC study found that only 11 percent of adults age 65 and older strength trained two or more days a week. So Palm Village decided to make it easy for residents to change that statistic.

But strength training and building muscle is only one small benefit of a regular exercise program, according to AARP researchers. The CDC

also states that a little physical activity goes a long way. At least 30 minutes of activity five or more days a week can improve a senior's overall health. And to prevent boredom while exercising, fitness professionals recommend changing your routine daily to keep your exercise experience fresh and exciting.

Major benefits of regular exercise include:

- Increased cardiovascular fitness
- Increased flexibility and muscle strength
- Decreased depression and anxiety
- Weight loss
- Lower blood pressure
- Reduction of the risk of heart disease
- Stronger immune system
- Prevention of bone loss

If you commit to meeting someone, you'll not only enjoy the exercise more, but also develop stronger friendships.

Before beginning any exercise program, the U.S. Surgeon General's office recommends following a few simple safety guidelines, starting

with discussing the program with your doctor. In addition, if your mobility is limited as a result of a chronic or disabling condition, be sure to review specific exercises with your doctor, and keep in mind your level of ability and endurance so that you don't risk discom-


The new Cottage Commons gated community for residents 62 and over is being built adjacent to Palm Village and offers buyers an option that will help plan for future retirement years.
